

Dear Friends,

I find myself optimistically saying in conversations, "It seems like we are getting back to normal".

Of course I am talking about how our life during the pandemic has been so abnormal. I also speak to how our church and church services have been so different (and not a desired different). But I am also hopeful that we are turning a corner. More and more folks are receiving the vaccinations. We are able to slowly incorporate back some of our worship traditions. Of course, when we speak of a "new normal" in this way, we are proclaiming the good news of the gospel. With Christ's resurrection, a new hope dawns, one that even the boldest disciples could not begin to understand. And when we live our lives by the example and joy of Christ, we create around us actions, communities, and relationships that aren't reflective of the "normal world" but instead of a world of Jesus that chose death over life, love over hate, and the eternal over the temporary.
