Every year, a former congregant would place a note of scripture in my mailbox at work as Holy Week began. It was one verse from the letter to the Colossians. *Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth* (Col. 3:2).

She observed many ministers over many years push through the "gauntlet" of Holy Week. We mustn't forget those three specific details of the Maundy Thursday service. And of course we shouldn't let the old traditions of Good Friday fall through the cracks as we prepared for Easter. And of course Easter morning! Make sure the brass is good to go, the flowers are well organized, and this better be the best sermon of the year!

If we were to let the week be dictated by our human standards we would very soon see our human flaws. But if we kept our minds focused on God, the peace of Christ, and the Good News of the Gospel, every imperfect moment would bring us immeasurable joy.

We are in the midst of one of the strangest times in my ministry. It is one of the trickiest times in our church and certainly one of the most frightening in our world. I would never have believed anyone who told me that the hardest Holy Week would be determined by slowness and not the rush, by the overwhelming absence and not the overwhelming presence.

I know that we all want to be in our sanctuary. We miss the songs of our choir, the prayers we share together, the preached word (I hope), and our shared communion. Phone calls and videos do not feel like enough. Yet we must remember that the standard for church is not determined by our desires but by the ongoing proclamation of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

In this time of uncertainty, I would ask that you join me in a mission that is so very hard for me to accomplish. Let us set our minds on those things above and trust that these will sustain us all below.

Peace, grace, and love as this Holy Week approaches. Rev. Jonah Smith-Bartlett



Hello BPCC Family!

Now more than ever with our current pandemic it's crucial that we as a church family stick together and support each other and our church. I'm writing today less as your office secretary and more as a lady whose passion for



ministry has no bounds and after a decade serving in every aspect of ministry is passionate about BPCC.

Right now we as a congregation are at a neat place in the history of the world and the church. It's absolutely terrifying for sure! But as believers, it's our obligation and joy to find God's blessings in all of this mess. This is our time to shine by persevering in prayer, in fellowship and dedication to our community We've had a lot of smaller changes over the last month that I've been here and with this new entrance of current events it's time for some slightly larger changes that I hope are for the best.

I'm going to ask you to go on a step of faith with me to help keep our beloved BPCC community thriving. It's going to take each and every one of us to turn this into a moment of growth for our church. There are some changes you will be seeing this week that I, personally, am going to ask you to have faith in, to engage in, and to help support.

- 1. Due to this virus AND Gov. Northam's executive order, there are absolutely NO meetings, events or anything at church. Yes, you may just be here by yourself, and you may not get sick. Please remember to send news here or to Jonah! Jonah is making calls and virtual visits possible for members so they never see an interruption in pastoral care despite the ability to be physically present.
 - -Please send all Prayer Requests, Medical Updates etc that you'd like shared with the congregation directly to me here! I will be sending out a weekly email to our congregation that includes prayer lists, news, scriptures for the week's sermons etc. to keep us connected.
- 4. We want you to stay CONNECTED! BPCC is blessed to have Jonah who is completely dedicated to keeping his flock cared for! There are Three ways he's doing this so far and we need you to click, to get engaged, to log on and be part of his hard work.

I personally want to thank Patsy for all her hard work, and for her grace in mentoring me through learning the bulletin, the Evangel and website. Starting this week we will keep everything that's on BPCC's Website, Facebook, and Youtube channels but will be editing and overhauling many of the things you have seen before. This is in an effort to make our media reach more accessible to the greater community. Mostly look for website updates, FB events etc. and the March Evangel to come out next monday. Have lots of patience and grace with me as I sort through piles of old duplicate email addresses if you get this twice!
