A letter from our pastor

We enter a season of Advent like none we have known before! Perhaps this is becoming a bit repetitive by now. We had a season of Lent like none before, a summer like none before, a fall and a Thanksgiving season just the same. Maybe you have already thought about this. Those four words of Advent-hope, joy, peace, and love-don't carry with them the same level of excitement as in previous years. Many of us have been unable to attend church. Some of us might feel like there is an exceedingly difficult absence in our lives where our faith community ought to be. So, what do we do this year?

I think first we might focus on those four words, the words that define each candle of Advent, in short, new ways. Ways that feel more appropriate for this time of waiting for the healing of our spirits through Christ as we wait also for the healing of our bodies.

Hope. In this time of hope we await not only a return to the way things were but a hope in the way things can be. Change is inevitable, but we can hope that in the way our world is shifting and in the way our church is as well, we might find something new that brings us closer to the presence of Jesus that we didn't know before. Maybe we have found hope in those small groups of folks who have helped keep us from loneliness. Maybe we have found hope that while our church is different, our church goes on. Perhaps we can have hope in a central truth to our faith-that God is with us in the hard places too. And God will continue to provide.

Peace. In the tumult of our world and our personal lives we pray for peace as we haven't known before. For some of us peace has been abstract. It's been something desperately needed in that place way over on the other side of the world. Certainly, we've always had some rocky moments in our lives but many of us have had the communities to sustain us through those times. But now we need peace in our city, in our country, and in our spirits. Peace can be elusive but if we now know how necessary it is, maybe collectively we can work even harder to discover it in those important places of our daily lives.

It wasn't gathering in the ideal way but it was still gathering. It was joyful because amidst all the mess of life, we found each other and found our need for one another in a new, powerful way. Absence makes the heart grow fonder, as they say. I've also found new joy in books, films, and conversations. I've found joy in things that I long took for granted. I've found joy in knowing that I won't take them for granted again. I've found joy, and I hope you have too, in knowing Christ's presence, even outside the doors of the church.

Love. It might be even more important to point out that for all the things that have changed during these many months of Covid, God's love eternally remains the same. We are waiting for the return of Christ as well. This wasn't part of the plan but the end of the promise still remains the same. God's Kingdom will shine even in the darkest of moments.

I continue to pray for all of you and I hope that you continue to pray for our church. As we are in this time of waiting, I also wait for that day when we will all be in our old familiar pews, social distancing will be a thing of the past, and we can sing those hymns with more gusto than ever before. I've never been a patient person but I hope that as we all wait together we might continue to find comfort in searching for that same promise and comfort in the unshakeable love of God that came to us in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Be well in this Advent season. Find those places of hope, peace, joy, and love. And keep your eyes fixed on when we can be back together. It will be a glorious Sunday morning!
